The V.J. has lost more than 50% of its inland forests, mangrove forests, large amounts of its sea grass beds, a number of salt ponds, and many of its coral reefs. Perhaps this is because we have forgotten the importance of our various ecosystems. The total area of beach on St. Thomas is only 41.90 acres, which is only 2% of the landmass. Of that we only have 7 beaches that are truly open to the public.



Mission


Activities


